Re: Supporting Family Practice with Personal Protective Equipment (PPE)

COVID-19 infection prevention and control measures have resulted in a significant increase in demand for Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) and pressures on national and provincial supply chains. We have clarified that in these unique times where 'normal' supply chains have been interrupted, Clinics that continue to provide direct in-person care to patients and are unable to source their own PPE may be able to receive support from Health Authorities to access PPE, based on available supplies and overall demand.

The Ministry of Health and Provincial Health Services Authority (PHSA) are partnering with the Product Distribution Centre to establish a sustainable supply chain and ordering process for all Community Partners to access directly; however, this will take a few weeks to setup. In the interim, Interior Health has developed guidelines and temporary processes to support Clinics that imminently require support in sourcing PPE.

For the purpose of this document:

- "Clinic" includes those clinics associated with the respective local Divisions of Family Practice and all those health care providers that can reasonably expect to be supported by the Divisions of Family Practice related to these matters.
- "PPE" includes procedure masks, exam gloves, and eye/face protection.

In order to best support Clinics' urgent PPE needs, Interior Health is looking to partner with the local Divisions of Family Practice to manage orders and deliveries of PPE regionally. Please note, PPE supply availability is very dynamic and changing daily. Requests for PPE support are vetted on a case by case basis and this offer of support is a temporary measure for our coordinated COVID-19 Pandemic response.

## **Guidelines**

To conserve provincial PPE supplies, all Clinics accessing Health Authority supply chains are expected to:

- Manage their supply chains independently wherever possible and to seek out all alternative sourcing opportunities available to them and the Divisions of Family Practice organization before reaching out through the temporary process described below.
- Track stock levels and daily usage on an ongoing basis and take measures to procure supplies
  proactively considering potential increased risk of supply disruptions and longer lead times.
- Follow all PPE guidelines and conservation strategies recommended by BCCDC and Interior Health.

 Utilize virtual care technology whenever possible to reduce the number of in-person patient encounters.

## **Temporary Process** (Until the Product Distribution Centre process is established)

Where Clinics have demonstrated a commitment to these practices and are still unable to source required PPE supplies, a consolidated request for PPE supplies can be submitted to Interior Health by the local Divisions of Family Practice:

- Requests for support with PPE should be directed to <u>ContractReports@interiorhealth.ca</u> on the attached Order Form documenting type and quantity of supplies required; include a message that indicates PPE supplies available and urgency of request, and that confirms that all other options for sourcing PPE supplies have been exhausted.
- Interior Health will keep the Divisions of Family Practice informed of any known third party supply chain opportunities that can support ongoing PPE sourcing needs.
- Immediate support for supplies is intended to provide short term support (3-5 days) while other alternative sourcing opportunities continue to be explored.
- All requests for supplies will be reviewed for reasonableness, will be prioritized alongside other requests, and fulfilled based on available inventory at the time.
- In some cases, PPE may not be available as specifically requested. Alternate products may be sent as substitutions for requested PPE, but will first be established as a suitable clinical alternative.
- All approved orders will be sent to the logistics warehouse for processing by the Contracted Services team.
- The Divisions of Family Practice will be expected to coordinate their own delivery of consolidated orders from the Kelowna Reid's Corner Warehouse. Where possible, Interior Health will support the Divisions of Family Practice with accessing these orders through established distribution channels. Delivery and pick-up details will be confirmed directly with the central contact as part of the ordering process.
- Costs for all orders will be tracked but not charged until further direction has been provided by the Ministry of Health.
- It should be noted that where support has been provided, it is on a without prejudice and exception basis. Clinics are expected to continue to explore and develop independent channels to support their ongoing PPE needs.

Managing the supply and usage of scarce PPE supplies requires a collaborative approach. Interior Health is committed to working alongside the Divisions of Family Practice, individual Clinics and other Community Partners in sharing best practices for the utilization and sourcing of PPE. As work continues on refining the supply chain, Interior Health will also be exploring further opportunities to integrate and support Clinics with their PPE needs.
